Mayor Kevin Morrison called the Budget & Finance committee meeting to order on Wednesday, December 2, 2020 at 1:00 P.M. in the Greene County Conference room at the Annex. A quorum was present.

Motion to approve the Budget & Finance minutes November 4th, 2020 was made by Commissioner Robin Quillen, seconded by Commissioner Paul Burkey. Minutes carried.

BUDGET AMENDMENTS:

For their review, the Committee received budget requests that had already been previously approved by Mayor Morrison.

BUDGET AMENDMENTS NEEDING APPROVAL BY THE BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE

Greene County Health Director Catherine Osborne Clerk requested that \$300 be transferred from Communication (307) into Other Fringe Benefits (299) for YMCA employees. Commissioner Burkey made a motion to approve the Health Department budget amendment request. It was seconded by Commissioner Waddle. All were in favor.

Greene County Trustee Nathan Holt requested that \$2,699 be transferred from Overtime (187). He is requesting to transfer \$1,519 into Assistant(s) (103) and the remaining \$1,180 into Clerical Personnel (162) to reflect new Krono timekeeping of weekly hours not excess of 40 hours being paid out of employee line item instead of Overtime Pay line item. Commissioner Burkey made a motion to approve the Trustee budget amendment request. It was seconded by Commissioner Quillen. All were in favor.

Greene County Election Commission Administrator Donna Burgner requested that \$10,362 be transferred from Election Workers (193) into Temporary Personnel (168). A request for 18,000 be transferred from the Clerical Personnel (162). The amount of \$10,000 of it be transferred also into the Temporary Personnel (168). The remaining \$8,000 going into the Overtime Pay line (187). Additional expenses are due to certifying the November election and clerical tasks involved. Commissioner Quillen made a motion to approve the Election Commission budget amendment request. It was seconded by Commissioner Waddle. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body, meeting in a regular session on December 21, 2020 authorized a five (5%) percent cost of living raise effective January 6, 2021 for all employees of Greene County Government (not including constitutional officials) with further adjustments to salaries based on the salary survey and/or cost of living index to be considered by the County Commission during the budget process for the 2021-2022 budget year.

WHEREAS, Jason Cobble who voted in favor of the resolution above described has stated: "I am not against the giving of a raise to the county employees and I have not found anyone that is. I failed to follow the process established that gives the taxpayers the most assurance of future stability for the additional budget item. Because the amount is large and recurring, I want to make certain to check every box so that giving a raise will not negatively impact those receiving the raise as well as the taxpayers. If this resolution fails, then I have satisfied my conscience. If by some chance it moves forward. I want to bring a resolution proposing a 5% pay raise for county employees to be approved by the budget and finance committee;" and

WHEREAS, Jason Cobble who voted in favor of the resolution above described now desires to rescind the resolution authorizing the five percent (5%) cost of living raise for all employees of Greene County Government passed by resolution at the December 21, 2020 Greene County Legislative Body Meeting.

A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY MAYOR TO SEEK BIDS FOR THE RENOVATION OF THE SEPTIC SYSTEMS AT KINSER PARK

WHEREAS, Greene County has jointly and individually operated Kinser Park in southern Greene County on property owned by the County and property leased from the Tennessee Valley Authority for more than forty years providing campsites and recreational opportunities for the citizens of Greene County as well as citizens from surrounding areas; and

WHEREAS, Kinser Park presently has 138 seasonal campsites and 23 weekend campsites serviced by a series of septic systems that are antiquated and deteriorating which can no longer handle the volume of discharge generated at the campsites; and

WHEREAS, because of the intrinsic value of Kinser Park to the citizens of Greene County, it would appear to be in the best interests of the citizens of Greene County and of Greene County Government to renovate the sewage systems for Kinser Park; and

WHEREAS, the Kinser Park Oversite Committee requested the assistance of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) to analyze and study the needed renovations and repairs to be performed to all septic systems that would service Kinser Park for many years to come; and

WHEREAS, Eric Ball with TDEC, after intensive study of the needs of the Park, has designed a system of septic tanks and drainage fields to accommodate the discharge from the campsites at Kinser Park; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the next logical step is to authorize the County Mayor with the assistance of the Purchasing Department to take bids for the installation of the septic systems as designed by the Department of Environment and Conservation to allow the County Commission to consider the actual cost in making the improvements as described above to Kinser Park.

WHEREAS, in accordance with §T.C.A. 5-12-105, the Greene County Legislative Body wishes to establish a budget calendar to comply with State guidelines to have an approved operating budget in place by July 1st and;

WHEREAS, in accordance with §T.C.A. 5-12-109, if no budget has been passed by July 1st, the operating budget for the prior year will continue by operation of law without any further action by the Greene County Legislative Body required. During this time, each department is allowed to spend one twelfth (1/12) of their total budget each month. The budget may be amended just like the final operating budget.

WHEREAS, this continuing budget may remain in effect for July and August. It can only extend through September 30th with the written approval from the Office of the Comptroller.

WHEREAS, if the Greene County Legislative Body and Greene County School Board fail to agree on an education budget by August 31st, then the education budget will go into effect by operation of law. The budget will be equal to the minimum budget required to comply with the local match and maintenance of effort provisions in the BEP.

APPOINTMENT OF 7TH DISTRICT COMMISSIONER

Mayor Morrison announced that five individuals had submitted applications to the Greene County Mayor's Office seeking the appointment of the 7th District Commissioner vacanted by Commissioner Butch Patterson due to his moving to a residence outside the commission district's boundaries. Submitting applications were April Harmon Lane, Jeffery L Justis, Steven Stout, and Kristin Girton, and Peter Higgins.

Mayor Morrison explained the voting process which a member of the Commissoner will nominate one of the five qualified candidates, and then we will proceed with a round of voting. The first candidate to receive 11 votes from the majority vote of the Commission will be seated as the new 7th District Commissioner. If none of the receive a majority vote from the first round of voting, the candidate receiving the least amount of votes will drop off and we will proceed to the second round of voting. The voting will continue until one of the candidates receive a majority vote.

April Harmon Lane was the first candidate to speak to the Commission via Zoom.

She stated that she works with five budgets in her currect position at Tusculum and also concentrated on finances in her previous position. She said, "If elected, I want to help Greene County move in the right direction."

Jeffery L Justis, a retired federal auditor said the reason he applied for the Commissioner position is to support the citizens in the district of the County and help them get the services they need and want without overtaxing them.

Steven Stout told the Commission that he would try to represent the people in his district.

"I want to try to make Greene County a better place for our kids and grandkids."

Kristin Girton told the Commission said she wants to be a voice for her community and help learn more about my community and about how she can be helpful, and listen to what the people in her district has to say.

Peter Higgins spoke to the Commission via ZOOM in regards to position of the 7th District Commissioner seat.

Commissioner Bowers nominated Jeffery L. Justis.

Commissioner Crawford nominated Steven Stout.

Commissioner Lawing nominated April Harmon Lane.

Commissioner Peters nominated Kristin Girton.

Commissioner Waddle nominated Peter Higgins.

Mayor Morrison asked three times; "Is there any other nominations."

Mayor Morrison announced that the nominaton cease.

Voting was conducted by individual voice vote. Mayor Morrison called each Commissioner by name in alphabetical order, and each Commissioner stated their name and stated their vote for the five candidates.

Voting was conducted by individual voice vote. Mayor Morrison called each Commissioner by name in alphabetical order, and each Commissioner stated their name and stated their vote for the name of their choice for the seat for 7th District Commissioner which was the following: Commissioners Arrowood, Bible, Burkey, Lawing, Powell, Shelton, and White voted for April Harmon Lane. 1 – vacant seat. Mayor Morrison stated that Peter Higgins would drop off on round one of
voting and the Commission would proceed with round two of voting for April Harmon Lane,
Jeffery L. Justis, Steven Stout, and Kristin Girton.

Voting was conducted by individual voice vote. Commissioner Tucker was absent and there was one vacant seat. There was 19 – aye; 0 – nay; 1 – absent; and 1 –vacant seat. The motion to cease all nominations and restrict to the consideration to the two candidates that is already deadlocked, with voting to be postponed until the next Commission meeting, which will be Tuesday, February, 16, 2021 passed.

Commissioner Bryant asked County Attorney Roger Woolsey about the communication between Commissioners to relate what they may know about the candidates. Roger Woolsey explained to the Commissioners that they could speak individually to the two candidates; however, state laws restricts any communications between Commissioners regarding governmental decisions outside a meeting.


