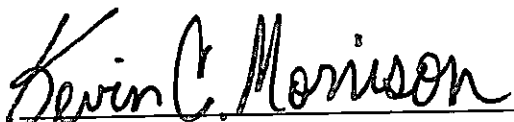

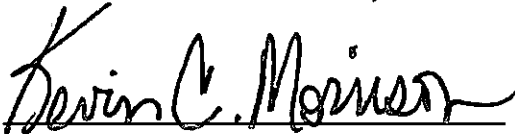

WHEREAS, Ronnie is most proud of successfully finishing the recovery court program because he has never accomplished such a big goal;

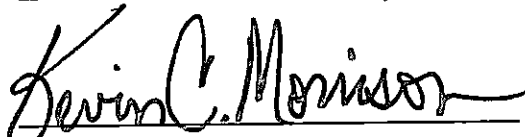

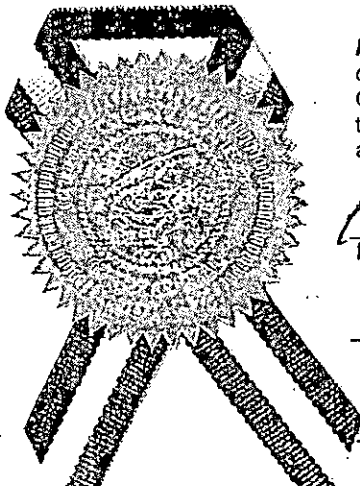

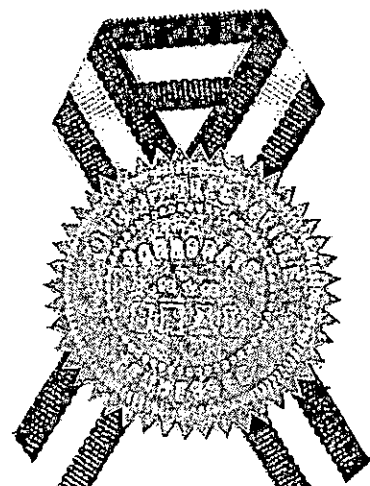

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, more than 12.7% of Greene County residents struggle to provide enough food for their families, and more than 20% of Greene County children are food insecure, meaning that they do not have regular access to adequate food. Many low-income Greene County families find themselves without enough food in the summer months and find it harder to make ends meet in the summer months. In addition, food insecurity among low-income children increases during the summer months as families struggle to make up for lost school meals; and

WHEREAS, low-income families spend an additional \$300 per month in the summer months to provide food for themselves and their children, as summer is a critical time for children's academic, physical, and mental development. Studies show that low-income children are particularly at a higher risk for food insecurity, hunger, and obesity during the summer months, and lose several months of learning in mathematics and reading. Furthermore, these studies show that children require regular and adequate nutrition all year long, and the summer meal programs provide nutritious, no-cost option food for these families and children; and

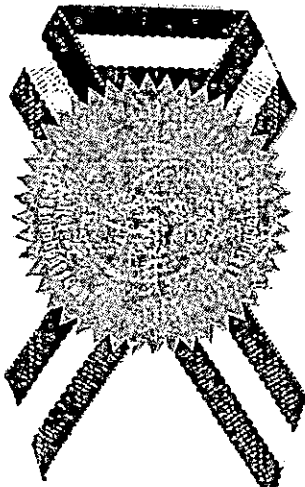
WHEREAS, there are children who are food insecure and suffer from increased risk of chronic diseases, increased rates of behavioral problems, decreased academic achievement, and long-term social and economic consequences. There are many children that participate in free and reduced-price school lunch, but during the summer months many of these children will go hungry without some type of summer feeding program in place. Other studies show that increased participation in the summer meal programs is associated with lower risks of household food insecurity as this program plays a vital role in helping low-income children access free, healthy meals during the summertime, thereby keeping them from going hungry when schools are closed; and

WHEREAS, Summer Meal programs can help children stay healthy and prepare them to return to school ready to learn and thrive. By increasing awareness about the Summer Meal programs through outreach in the community and investing in summer programming to attract more kids to meal sites, Greene County can increase access to Summer Meals programs. Greene County, Tennessee, is committed to ensuring that no child goes hungry this summer.

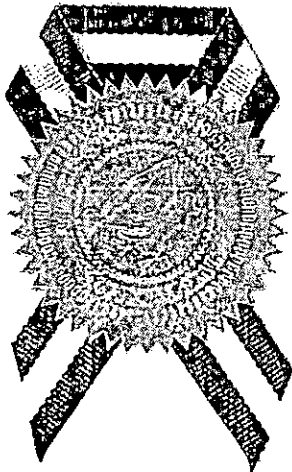

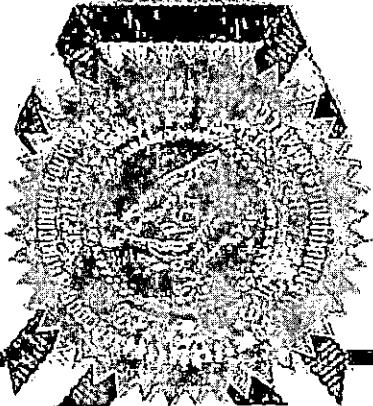

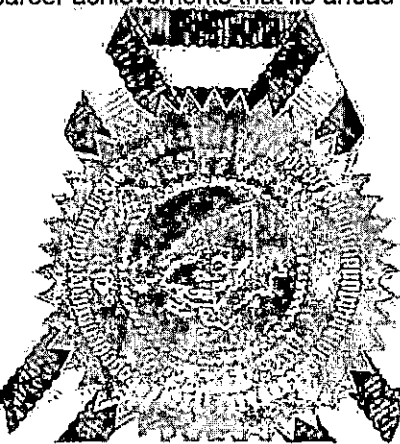

- 7. Spot Zoning – With agricultural land surrounding this property, it appears that this would be a spot zoning change.**

Zoning Change A to B 290 Roaring fork Rd

We are retired and bought our place eight years ago while looking for a nice quiet agricultural area. We found this special place in Greeneville where we ride our horses, have the neighborhood kids fish in our pond and enjoy the countryside. The area has cattle, horses, hay fields , rolling hills and we love it here.

We are opposed to any zoning change from Agriculture to Business for this property on any of the 20 acres. We have included 2 pictures: (#1) One showing the property from our front porch, and (#2) showing the length of property line we share which is about 1,500'.

If the zoning is changed from Agricultural to business, these are our concerns:

With 20 acres there would be plenty of room to expand any business for current and future owners.

1.Traffic

If this change takes place there would be much more traffic on the property's long 1 lane long gravel driveway. This traffic would be noisy and dusty. The coming and going of the vehicles would be very noticeable in this quite area. The business proposed is a trucking business that consists of sales of new and used big trucks. Repairing big trucks like Kenworth and Peterbilt, hauling gravel, grading and bobcat work. These big trucks, trailers, along with other business vehicles will create noise and dust traveling back and forth on a long oneway driveway. We would see and hear every single truck's arrival and departure. These are not small trucks.

2.Parking lot

At the end of the driveway where the barns are would be where everyone visiting a business and all the trucks would be parking, turning around and backing up. That would mean we would be hearing normal business activities, back up beeps, costumers vehicles in and out all day. There would be the big tow trucks with their flashing lights bringing big trucks in for repairs. At night and when daylight savings time comes there would be headlights shining on our property as customers arrive, park , turn around and leave.

3.Future zoning changes.

If this zoning is changed some people (I'm not saying it's the case here) might look at it as an opportunity to buy less expensive Ag land, change zoning to business, and then sell to make a nice profit. This could cause even more people requesting zone changes in this immediate area and further affect those of us who moved here to live in an Agricultural/Residential area.

4. Reale estate values

Surrounding property values, with a new business typically would decrease from 5%-15% or more initially. Then depending on how that business was handled it could be much more of a decrease. For the current and future families to take a decrease in home values for this zoning change just doesn't seem fair.

Call to Order:

Mayor Morrison called meeting to order in the conference room at the Greene County Annex. Quorum was present.

Minutes:

Motion was made by Commissioner Crawford and was seconded by Sheriff Holt to approve the minutes from February 25, 2026. Motion was approved with no opposition.

Reports:

Clinic – Leslie Jones gave the clinic reports for February 2026. There were 267 patients. Of the 267 visits, there were 121 provider visits and 146 nurse visits, which was down from last year but when she looked, they did a lot of randoms last year. There were 5 no shows, of which 3 were nurse visits and 2 were provider visits. Leslie stated there were 41 biometric physicals. Leslie stated that there are 89 non-compliant employees/spouses, however, 54 of that 89 have appointments scheduled between now and the end of April, which leaves 35 having no appointments at all. Leslie stated there are appointments available for those that are non-compliant. Leslie stated she felt that EMS was the biggest department that had the most non-compliant employees/spouses. Mayor Morrison stated he has directed maintenance to get the parking lot cleared close to the clinic and also to install signage for patient parking at the clinic (close to the awning). Mayor also stated they have reached out to David Weems to fill the hole where the gas tank was removed and that should be completed within the next few days.

Attorney Woolsey made a motion to approve the clinic reports and the reports were approved without objection.

Financial - Danny Lowery emailed the financial reports with notes for February 2026 to the Insurance Committee on March 20, 2026. Danny stated we continue to move right along and nothing fantastic to report either way. Danny stated liability and workers comp seems to be recovering pretty well and settling out and reserves are going back to normal compared to a year ago. Danny stated the changes we made with SHARx back in the fall with employee health seems to have taken hold. Danny stated the next thing to dive into with Chris would be checking on employee claims to see what are traditional office visits and see what we can do on a more proactive basis to move those more toward the clinic. Danny stated it's lining up to have our claims

and total cost to flat to a little down compared to last year. The Mayor stated that the covered lives are up about 25 from a year ago and asked if that was due to employees that we've added? Danny stated it has been that way for the last 2 years and he assigns that to having increased salaries and positions have been steadily full across the board. Danny stated that most of our employees have some form of our health insurance especially since the one option costs them nothing if they are in compliance with their biometrics. Sheriff Holt stated we probably see a lot more spouses coming on too if insurance is too high where the spouse works, however, Erin reminded the Sheriff that they are not suppose to add spouses to health if the spouse is already offered health insurance at their own employment. Spouses can only be covered on our health insurance if they are self-employed, unemployed or no health insurance is offered to them at their place of employment. Danny stated with the implementation of the pay scale the covered lives initially jumped up then and also filling the open positions increased the covered lives. Erin stated that less than 5 positions have actually been added. Danny stated that we've actually not grown the size of our government over the last couple of years but we've just filled open positions. Mayor Morrison stated that the EMS department, as of today, is 100% staffed.

A motion to approve the financial reports was made by Sheriff Holt. Motion was seconded by Chris Malone, Greene County School Director. Reports were approved with no opposition.

Other Business.

Mayor Morrison introduced Trena McCauslin with Clinch-Powell to speak to the committee about what her company offers to this area for recovery from Hurricane Helene damage. Mayor is allowing Trena to do this presentation so she can get the word out about the assistance that is available to people who qualify. Mayor stated there was a similar grant program through the First Tennessee Development District that sent back a million dollars because no one signed up for the assistance. Trena McCauslin, a Greene County native, stated she was the Executive Director of Clinch-Powell RC&D (Resource, Conservation & Development) and she is based in Rutledge, Tennessee but Greene County is one of their service counties. Trena stated being a Greene County native makes this personal for her and she wants to bring the resources of this agency into this area. They are a community housing development organization and also have HUD certified housing counselors on staff. Trena stated that the funds that are available for residents right now is a pool of special money set aside (is not automatic with state and federal funds) and can take awhile for those funds to become available to individuals in need because they have to wait until FEMA is wrapped up and insurance claims are closed out. Trena stated the funds that they have available are for repairing a home, replacing a home and reimbursement for repairs on a home. Trena stated anything above what was not covered through FEMA and/or insurance claims, individuals can apply for reimbursement through their plan. Trena stated these are USDA Rural Development funds. Trena stated there are strict guidelines on who qualifies for these funds. The pools that they have access to covers individuals who are in the \$59,900 - \$119,000 maximum income range. Trena stated they have many products available, not just disaster money. Trena stated there are 14 counties designated as Hurricane Helene disaster counties and damage could be wind and rain damage also. Trena stated the funds are there and available to individuals with

damage from Helene but we just have to get the word out there to them. Trena stated that they have one intake application for individuals to fill out and they will assess eligibility for all products.

John McInturff stated he did not see an issue with the CDL training in house for employees, but he will double check and confirm. John stated that they have added the property coverage for the helipad and T.J. has provided to John the number of landings per year and there are 4 entities using the helipad. John stated that T.J. did not have certificates of insurance from those entities but John suggested obtaining certificates from them and Attorney Roger Woolsey agreed that we do need certificates. Attorney Woolsey suggested starting with T.J. (since he provided the list to John) to get in touch with these entities to obtain certificates of insurance. John stated that he is not sure there are any contracts with these entities using the helipad and do we need contracts with these entities? Attorney Woolsey stated yes, we need contracts with all of the entities using the helipad. John asked Mayor Morrison if a certificate of occupancy had been issued for the Takoma Building and Mayor stated, yes, for the first floor only and no for the 2nd and 3rd floor. John asked if there was a completion date for the remainder of the building and the reason he asked is because the Builders Risk Insurance renews 7/15. Erin stated the 2nd and 3rd floors possibly completed by the end of this year. Sheriff stated the kitchen is coming along good and many agreed that the kitchen looks good. John has to provide information for the Builders Risk renewal and he confirmed with Mayor that the 2nd and 3rd floors are 75%-80% complete and Mayor said that was accurate. Mayor stated the flooring and ceiling grid are yet to be complete on the 2nd floor.

Chris Poynter with Baldwin Group handed out an Impact Report for the SHARx program to the committee members. Chris stated he wanted to give an update (after the 1st quarter) for the SHARx program and after March he will have another report. The savings in the first quarter is \$95,867. Danny and Chris agreed it has made a difference so far.

Chris stated as far as the dummy claims it doesn't really matter what charges we put in and to just put in some dummy charges because what really matters is the BCBS allowable charge. Chris stated we don't really care what goes in the top end charge so we will estimate them high but what really matters is the back end and what BCBS allowable charge is. Leslie stated that they are still having issues with the EMR (clearing house – BCBS) and being rejected and going back and forth with them on that. Chris said he would check on it and get back with Leslie. Leslie went on to say it is a very tedious and time-consuming process on the front end because all insurance information has to be input on all patients.

Chris stated that we are going to end up with a good single digit renewal for the Stop Loss. Chris stated he has most stuff back and just waiting on final numbers and should have the renewal available to present at next meeting.

Chris stated that he's working on a report of a breakdown of claims and he will give us a warning because he will need a little time on the agenda to present to the committee. Chris stated he thinks we have done a good job at controlling the Pharmacy but we are seeing more than normal inflation

on the medical side. Chris stated he doesn't think it will be a forever thing but believes the bar is being reset on us for a year or so. Chris stated increase could be in the 8-10% range and stated that contracts are being redone at the facility level. Chris stated it's not utilization it's the cost of the actual stuff going on. Chris stated we need to keep an eye on everything and we have not done an increase in premiums in forever but we need to be prepared for when the time comes. Attorney Woolsey asked Chris Malone, Director of Schools, over the last 10 years has the school system changed what the employees have to pay? Chris stated they have kept the same percentage increase for their employees but the state changes and it's a 12% increase this year. Commissioner Peters asked Chris Poynter if at some point we're going to have to look at the premiums and employees pay? Chris stated we are kind of leveled out right now but with what is going on with these hospital contracts things could begin to go the other way. Commissioner Peters questioned whether the employees will come out better with increased premium or a wage increase? There was continued discussion between committee members concerning the fact that the premiums have not been increased in 10-12 years. Attorney Woolsey stated in the past there was no increase in pay for 7 years but the insurance was killing the county. Attorney Woolsey voiced his concern if the commission/commissioners ever asked the question of what is insurance costing us for all the county employees, it would make them very upset. However, Danny said he didn't think so because with the decade that he has been here they have never had to adjust it. Attorney Woolsey went on to voice his concern if commissioners ever questioned why the school system employees are paying way more than what the county employees are paying and Danny reiterated that the schools' plan is not our plan. More discussion between Commissioner Peters, Attorney Woolsey, Chris Malone and Danny Lowery concerning the differences between the schools' plan and our plan. Attorney Woolsey reminded the committee when they had to raise the employee's premiums by \$25.00 and everyone went bonkers and Attorney Woolsey went on to say that the former broker said another option was to not make the plan not as rich. Chris Malone stated that's what happens with the state plan, premiums go up and coverage goes down at the same time. Continued discussion between Chris Malone, Attorney Woolsey, Danny, John McInturff, Erin Elmore and Chris Poynter about the differences in schools' plan and our plan and retirees. Chris Malone stated that they only pay 64% of the employees' premiums where Greene County pays around 90+%. Chris Malone stated that they kick in money on their HSA if they're on the CDHP plan. They kick into the HSA the difference between the premium of the CDHP Plan versus the premium of the Premium Plan. Chris stated if the employee is young and healthy it's a great deal.

Chris Malone, Director of Schools, stated the director of 4-H came to him asking why, since Greene County has a 4-H camp, would they not provide buses for field trips during 4-H summer camp? Attorney Woolsey said that is a decision for Chris and the insurance committee. Chris stated, at the moment, they are getting buses from Washington County to use for their field trips. Attorney Woolsey stated it is possible and he does not have a problem with it as long as 4-H would be paying the expenses (or reimbursing the schools) for the use of the buses. Attorney Woolsey asked the committee what they thought? Committee members discussed for a few minutes. The consensus amongst the committee was if it helps the community and the kids in Greene County, they are in favor. A motion to allow 4-H UT Extension to use county school buses during the

summer for field trips was made by Sheriff Holt. Motion was seconded by Attorney Roger Woolsey. Motion was approved with no opposition.

John McInturff with MM&B stated to let your department heads know that Amanda will be getting in touch to get updated lists of vehicles to be covered on insurance.

Mayor Morrison stated just as an FYI for the committee, they had a contractor take down the old club house at the golf course at Kinser Park. The building was damaged by Hurricane Helene and had stood unoccupied and unused for a good period of time which led to water and moisture damage. The insurance company informed the manager that it would be in the best interest to take that building down. Mayor Morrison stated that Buddy Hensley took down the building and the removal is complete. Mayor Morrison went on to say that he reached out to T.V.A. and they allowed and supported the removal of the building.

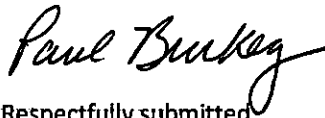

Board of Trustees Meeting Minutes

Friday, February 13, 2026

Main Library, Big Spring Room

The Greeneville/Greene County Library Board of Trustees met for a rescheduled quarterly meeting on Friday, February 13, 2026 at 3:30 PM in the Big Spring Room of the Greeneville/Greene County Public Library. The original meeting date was January 26, 2026, but had to be rescheduled several times due to winter weather. Members in attendance were: Erin Stayton, Tim Ward, Nancy Southerland, Mia Hyde, Pat DeCicco, Teddy Lawing, library director Erin Evans, and assistant director Christopher Gose. The Holston River Regional Library was represented by Jennifer Breuer, and the Friends of the Library was not represented.

Welcome and Call to Order-Erin Stayton

Chair Erin Stayton called the meeting to order at 3:30 PM and introductions of the board took place.

Public Comments

No guests in attendance or public comments were made.

Approval of Minutes-October 27, 2025

Ms. Stayton asked for the approval of minutes from the October 27, 2025 meeting. She asked if anyone noted any corrections to the minutes and none were offered. With that, a motion to approve the October minutes was made by Tim Ward and seconded by Pat DeCicco. The motion passed unanimously.

Financial Report - Erin Evans

Director Evans reviewed the financial statement. She provided an update on the budget for 2025-26. Erin Evans asked if there were any questions about the budget and none were offered. A motion was made by Nancy Southerland to accept the financial report and a second was made by Tim Ward. The motion was passed unanimously.

Library Director's Report - Erin Evans

Director Evans provided an update on circulation and programming. We have a few less library cards issued this quarter. There were 295 cards issued. Checkouts are higher than this quarter last year, with 15,759 checkouts. Wifi sessions and internet visits remain high. READS checkouts remain high. There were 37 events in the last quarter. The programs served 288 children and 309 adults. Twenty volunteer hours were logged. One field trip was hosted this quarter, which had eleven students. Santa's Storytime was a success with strong attendance by both children and parents. An ASL class was offered and 51 adults attended. Technology classes for adults resumed in January 2026.

Next, Director Evans provided an update on the Open House and Friends of the Library annual meeting. While there was not a sign in/guest book, the open house was attended by several hundred people throughout the day. The feedback from attendees was very good and positive.

The Big Spring room is now fully functional after the plumbing repairs. The room continues to get a lot of use, with several events each week. Director Evans has submitted a reimbursement request to Mayor Morrison in the amount of \$46,494 on January 2, 2026.

The budget amendment that included \$30,000 for a new roof on the library was passed at the January 20, 2026 City Council meeting. City Council asked Lora Young to investigate the possibility of an insurance claim for the repairs. The first leak on the roof occurred in August 2023. Erin will get some estimates on the roof repair costs.

The Book Sale was moved from the location at Greene Valley to George Clem Elementary on November 13, 2025. The library has received permission to use the gym and the bus shop at George Clem for this year's sale. The Book Sale committee will meet later this week. Sorting will begin the first week of March. Tentatively the sale will be the first three weekends of May.

"Take Your Child to the Library Day" is a national event that took place on February 7, 2026 from 9:30-12:30. There was a scavenger hunt, crafts for children, and goodie bags. About 50 children attended.

Finally, Director Evans gave an update on the summer reading program. A Fox Foundation grant has been completed for \$2,000. A funding request to the Buell and Mildred Brooks Foundation at Trinity Methodist Church will also be made to support the summer reading program. The library staff is beginning to plan the summer program content. A planning committee is working on the details for the event.

T. Elmer Cox Report - Christopher Gose

Assistant Director Gose reported that the T. Elmer Cox library has had increased income over the last quarter. This quarter, there were 116 visitors. An Ancestry and Family Search workshop was held on November 11, 2025 with 8 people in attendance. A TSLA grant has been received for the James N. Hardin collection, and the collection is being processed and posted online. The library has received the check for approximately \$16,500 from the American 250 Grant for shelving and supplies. The library is designing a new gallery exhibit for the America 250 celebration with the focus on the founding of Greeneville that should be ready around the end of February. The Heritage Home Scholars are scheduled for Spring 2026 with 18-20 students. The removal of appliances and kitchen cabinets continues on the second floor to make room for more archival storage. The Greeneville Sun has made an inquiry regarding the transfer of their newspaper archives and photo collection to the Cox library.

Further, Gose said that another America 250 grant has been submitted for a large, oversized scanner. In addition, the library received a special merit award from Greene County Heritage Trust for public service. The City Council acknowledged this award during a City Council meeting. Finally, the upstairs air conditioning unit will need to be replaced.

Board Chair Items-Erin Stayton

Chair Erin Stayton announced that Sangela Blue's tenure on the board is complete. Her position will need to be filled by someone who represents Greene County. The County Commission must approve the recommendation. Recommended are Sheril Whitehouse, Tim Massey, and Andy Williams. Erin Stayton opened the discussion to the group. Tim Massey is president of Heritage Trust and is a local historian. Sheril Whitehouse has experience with library sciences and worked in a library at the University of North Florida. She is currently the GSIA president at Greeneville

High School. She also volunteers at local churches to organize their music libraries. No one was able to speak on behalf of Andy Williams. Teddy Lawing nominated Sheril Whitehouse and second by Nancy Southerland. All agreed and the motion passed. The nomination will go to the County Commission in March.

Old Business - Erin Stayton

The Library Policy regarding unattended bags no longer needs to be addressed. The policy as written does not need to be changed.

The Emergency Procedures Manual has a section on "Patron Behavior." Homelessness has increased and an addition to the policy might be needed. Nancy Southerland asked if the county has any policies that we may reference. Tim Ward suggested calling 911 as needed. Holston River Regional Library representative, Jennifer Breuer, referenced a "Code of Conduct" on health hazards that may be helpful. Measuring and quantifying these policies can be challenging. There may be options such as a "scent-free zone." Training on active shooters and how to use a fire extinguisher might be needed trainings. The manual will be sent to the board for review. Teddy Lawing suggested that a policy be added that if schools go on lock down, the library should be locked down as well. The panic buttons will also be checked. If the board has other recommendations, send them to Erin Stayton.

New Business-Erin Stayton

There are two campuses that are open a combination of 72 hours a week. There are only 3 full time employees and six part-time employees. Programming has increased and the library is used more than in the past. Director Evans would like to make one part-time employee a full-time employee. He currently makes \$21,500 a year. It is proposed to make his salary \$31,200 with an additional \$10,000 needed for benefits for a total of \$41,600. An annual gift of \$17,000-20,000 from Friends of the Library will be given to supplement this full-time position. A motion was made by Tim Ward to accept this position and increase his pay to \$15/per hour plus benefits and seconded by Nancy Southerland. The motion was passed.

Friends of the library - Carla Bewley

No report from Friends of the Library.

Holston River Regional Library report – Jennifer Breuer

The February newsletter was disseminated. Tim Ward received his certificate of completion of the Trustee Certification program. Two employees received their Core Competencies certificates. Greeneville Library will host the accessibility showcase on April 23rd.

MEMORANDUM

Subject: Request to rezone 290 Roaring Fork Road
Tax parcels: 074-027.08 and 027.17
Owner: Elizabeth P. Malone
Applicant: Ben and Kelsie McInturff
Zone: A-1, General Agriculture District
Requested: B-2 General Business District
Zoning: The properties and the surrounding area are zoned A-1.
Size: Two parcels totaling 19.99 acres. Parcel 027.08 (10.03 acres) is vacant; parcel 027.17, which measures 9.96 acres, contains two sheds and a "farm shop".
Variance: If the rezoning request becomes effective, a variance to the rear yard setback would be needed for the "farm shop", which is located almost 1,500' from Roaring Fork Road and 25 feet from the rear property line. The building was permitted to be constructed because it houses what was an agricultural use, which is not required to meet setbacks.
Land Use: The area contains a mixture of residential and agricultural uses.
LUP: The *Greene County Land Use and Transportation Policy Plan* (LUP) list commercial goals as: (the numbers refer to the number of the goal listed in the plan on pp. 108-109)

2. **"Commercial development should be approved only in those areas where adequate infrastructure is available to support such development."** The infrastructure is adequate for the proposed use.
3. **"Commercial development should be designed so as to minimize potential negative impacts to the existing transportation system"**. The use should not negatively impact the transportation system;
4. **"Clustering of commercial developments should be encouraged, with controlled entrance and exit points"**. If rezoned, this would be the only commercial use in the area, so clustering is not possible.
5. **"Commercial uses which are high intensity traffic generators should be located on major collector or arterial roads."** The proposed use should not be a high intensity traffic generator.
7. **"All commercial and private service developments shall be provided with adequate access aisles and an adequate number of off-street parking spaces, as per the Zoning Resolution of the county."** If the rezoning is approved, this will be addressed in the site plan.

8. **“Commercial developments should be designed so as to minimize negative impacts to residential developments via planted buffers and/or berms in order to enhance the aesthetics and property values of such developments.”** The zoning resolution requires that the 30’ rear yard setback, which abuts a residential use, to “be completely buffered with plant material or fencing.” While landscaping and/or fencing will help screen the use from adjoining properties, it will not necessarily decrease the noise associated with a garage servicing dump trucks.

If the setback variance is granted, the rear yard will be approximately 25’ instead of the required 30’.

A general development goal (p. 98) is “[t]o preserve, protect and enhance the quality of life in Greene County while encouraging a more harmonious and higher standard of development.” It is the finding of planning staff that the presence of 10 commercially zoned acres surrounding by residential uses and agricultural fields (appropriate for future residential development) is not a “more harmonious” use and would not encourage a “higher standard of development”.

Residential objective A (p. 105) is to “[p]rovide for a variety of housing types and densities for a wide range of family incomes, sizes, and lifestyles, while protecting and maintaining the quality of life and property values in existing residential areas.” It is generally accepted that locating a commercial use so far back on a property (almost 1,500’), where it abuts several residential uses, would not be “protecting and maintaining the quality of life” for the surrounding residential uses.

Residential goal 6 is: “[t]he County should encourage low-density housing along roads adjacent to agricultural areas, which are buffered from excessive noise, traffic, and conflicting development.” Roaring Fork Road meets this standard as being appropriate for residential, instead of commercial, development, in an area where the surrounding acreage contains several large agricultural tracts. Its location adjacent to Roaring Fork Road is buffered from the traffic and noise associated with higher traffic volumes and larger trucks that use Baileyton Road (approximately 1,500 feet away).

General Development and Growth Management Objective C (p. 104): the “[p]rotection and enhancement of present and future livability.” Starting a commercial zone in an established residential area that has ongoing residential development, is generally not good practice. Doing this creates the potential for spot zoning, which is a rezoning that benefits one property owner over other property owners.

The appearance of the garage will not be visible from Roaring Fork Road, but the same might not be true for any expansion area.

RZ Rationale: The rezoning rationale sheet for the request is attached. More weight should be given to the "Reasonableness" section than the other sections

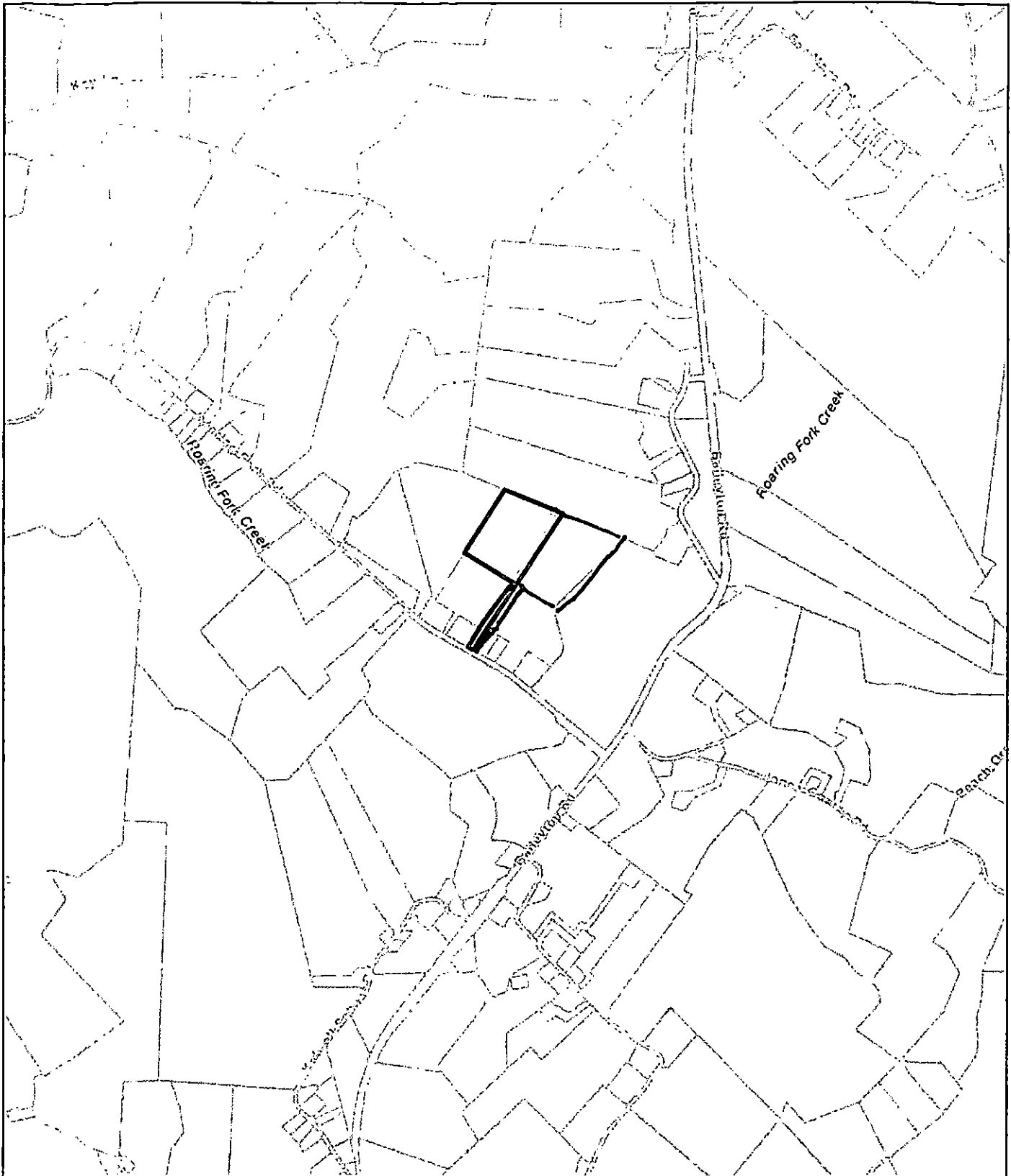
Notes: The closest the LUP comes to discuss spot zoning is the goal recommending that commercial uses be clustered. Spot zoning is zoning one property to permit a use not permitted on surrounding properties, generally in violation of the long range plan and for the benefit of one property owner. The term "generally" is used intentionally, as some may argue that the request meets many of the commercial goals of the Plan.

Options:

1. Recommend the rezoning, as it meets many goals and objectives of the LUP for commercial uses.
2. Recommend denial of the request, as the proposal:
 - a. Could be considered spot zoning, as it would introduce a zone not related to surrounding zoning or land use;
 - b. Is unlikely to provide the protection for residential uses in the area as advocated in the LUP;
 - c. The Rezoning rationale sheet indicates that it is not appropriate to rezone for a commercial district in this area.
3. Recommend postponement, pending the receipt of additional information.

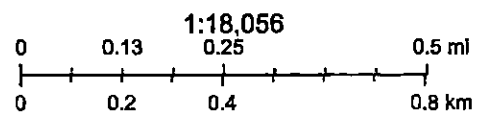
Recommend: Staff recommend that the request be denied, as it does not meet the LUP in regard to protecting residential uses, the rezoning rationale sheet indicates that rezoning is premature, and placement of a commercial garage in an established residential area would likely provide a negative impact to surrounding properties.

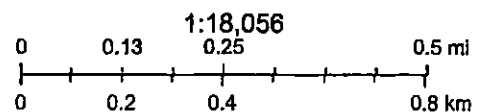

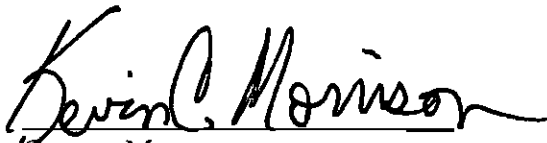

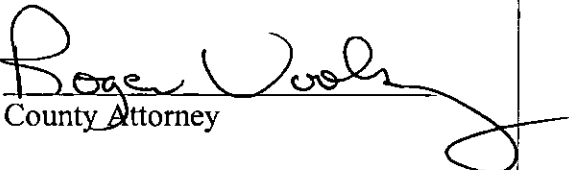
